SMILE team in Slovenia – October 2018



Teams from Malta, Cyprus and Sweden were hosted by the Institute for African Studies to learn about migrant inclusion in adult education in Slovenia.

The visit is part of a series of learning visits that aim to bring together migrants, teachers, policymakers and NGO staff in order to promote a broad, inclusive dialogue on the relevance and effectiveness of adult education programmes for migrants.

The team was made up of teachers, persons with international protection, third country nationals, and project coordinators. The team was hosted by Cene Štupar (Public Education Centre) and Drustvo Odnos (NGO working with refugees) in Ljubljana. There were also presentation by the National education Institute of Slovenia, the NGO platform SLOGA, the Employment Service of Slovenia and Government Office for the Support and Integration of Migrants. Several members of the team also shared their experiences and perspectives. These contributions will guide the development of SMILE resources for migrants, educators and policymakers, which will be used to promote access to migrant education.
